

# Donna Kooistra's program in March: While the Bread Was Baking.

This lecture will focus on needlework and other pastimes that women were occupied with during and after the Great Depression. Examples would be linens, doilies, dresser scarves, tea table cloths, and many other items that perhaps took less time than the quilts we see from that era. These items could be worked on "while the bread was baking." Donna will talk about the history going into this time period and share special linens and examples of projects for beautifying the home. Participants are encouraged to bring linens or handmade items from the 1930s - 1940s that may mean something special to them. Of course, Donna will also bring some quilts to share from this era in history where women made their homes a pleasant place to be in difficult days.
