

Block and 5" Square Drawing Winners

Please remember, when your name is drawn, get your preferences to Cindy Lash (email is on the front page) ASAP so that she can get the info into the next newsletter! Thank you!

Blocks: Beverly Bartlett and Shari Targgart (see specifics below)

5" squares: Sharon Zonker—Black/white small prints or geometric prints

Cindy Lash—Civil War prints; 2 dark and 2 light; all different

Bev would like a 10 1/2" (unfinished) Lucky Stars block in brights and white or white-on-white. You can choose to use either one bright or two in your block.

Cut: White (or white-on-white): A-(4) 3 1/2" x 3 1/2"

B-(4) 3 1/2" x 4 1/2"

Bright: C-(8) 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" Bright (same or different): D-(1) 4 1/2" x 4 1/2"

Sew: Mark a diagonal line on the back of the C squares. Stitch to B rectangles as shown below. Sew into rows and then sew rows together.













PLEASE DO NOT TRIM BLOCK!


Stitch on line, trim & press toward bright.

Shari would like a Strippy Heart block in assorted Christmas prints with a white-onwhite background (in a Christmas pattern, if you can find one.)


Cutting: A (6) different Christmas prints 1 1/2" x 6 1/2"


- B (4) white-on-white 1 1/2" x 1 1/2"
- C (2) white-on-white 3 1/2" x 3 1/2"
- D (2) white-on-white 2" x your measurement (see step 4 below)
- E (2) white-on-white 2" x your measurement
- Piecing: 1. Sew the "A" Christmas prints lengthwise into 2 sets of 3. If any are directional prints, please place them in their proper orientation. Press seams open. (see diagram 1.)
- 2. Lay the background squares on top of the strip sets, right sides together. Using a ruler and pencil, mark the back of the squares with a diagonal line. Sew on the marked lines and press the background pieces away from the center of the heart. Trim away the excess. (see diagram 2.)
 - 3. Sew the two sides of the heart together. Press center seam open.
 - 4. Square up your block, if necessary. (Shari says, "I squared up the heart at 6" x 6 1/4".)


Measure through the block horizontally, then cut two strips 2" x your measurement. After sewing to the top and bottom of the heart, measure through the block vertically, cut two strips 2" x your measurement and sew to the sides. Press seams away from heart. DO NOT RE-SOUARE UP!
