

Tips & Tricks:

Cleaning your cutting mat:

Put your mat in the bathtub or large container so it can lay flat. Soak for 15-20 minutes in a solution of 1/4 cup white vinegar to every gallon of cool water. Scrub with a soft brush to remove fibers trapped in the cuts that don't allow your self-healing mat to heal. Use a squirt of mild dishwashing liquid to help clean the mat. Let lay flat to dry, after rinsing with cool water.
